“Black Men in White Coats” is a documentary film that highlights the lack of Black men in medicine and encourages communities to support high school and college-age Black males in becoming physicians. In addition to the free screening, you’ll have the opportunity to discuss the film with our panelists, gain insights into the Black male experience in medicine and learn about programs Stony Brook offers to help attract Black males to the field of medicine.

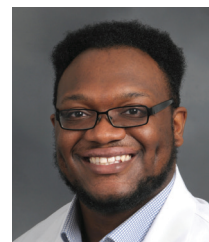

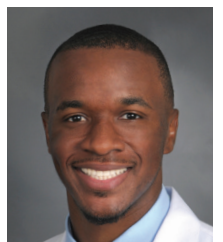
